We are challenged with the job of removing or eliminating the non-academic barriers to learning. Throughout the year this is addressed in many different ways, but in August we are primarily providing schools supplies, clothing, and a variety of other immediate needs. On August 17th, we sized nearly 200 students in the district for shoes through the Happy Feet program. The students are eagerly awaiting their arrival. We have also begun the school based compressive dental program this year by serving 128 students so far at LCMS and NLES. Last but not least, the Snack Pack Program is also well underway at this time, thanks to incredible community support.
